- IV. Health Commissioner Report:** Mr. Migliozi presented a written report to the Board for their review. Mr. Migliozi also reported to the Board the following: Out of 113 local health districts, our agency ranks 11th in vaccine administration, which is 95.43%, 90% is the threshold to be considered effective. As of 3/22/21, there are 48,614 people who have received their 1st dose, and 26,806 people who have completed their vaccinations, with 1/3 of those vaccinations being administered by the local health district. Trumbull county's population is 197,974, with 45,584 being under the age of 18, which leaves 157,390 people eligible to be vaccinated and 108,776 left to be vaccinated. Trumbull county has vaccinated 27,604 persons ages 65 and above, which is 63%. We are working with partners, such as Dr. Enyeart, to get more of our senior population vaccinated. We are also working with the EOC and Direction Homes to get our homebound population vaccinated. Direction Homes has a list of the homebound in our county; they confirm that the person is homebound and shares that list with us. We give out the vaccine to EMS personnel, whom we have trained on how to handle and care for the vaccine, and they administer the vaccine to the homebound. This is working well, and we will continue with this effort. Mr. Migliozi also reported that he had reached out to the Dean of Kent State University Trumbull, and we will be working with them to plan and hold a vaccination clinic for their staff and students to make a safe campus environment. Due to the efforts of Dr. Enyeart, we have also held several Saturday clinics, and will need more as the eligibility age is lowered.

Mr. Migliozi also gave credit to Mr. Simon in his efforts to stop the passage of SB 22; however, it was passed. This bill severely restricted the authority of the Governor and the Ohio Department of Health to timely and efficiently respond to outbreaks of communicable disease public health emergencies. Mr. Simon reached out to local lawmakers to vote against this bill. Governor DeWine is planning on vetoing the passage. Mr. Migliozi stated that he would inform the Board of any further developments.

Mr. Simon gave an update to the Board on the proposed vaccination building, which was to be constructed on the fairgrounds. Since the last meeting, the Trumbull County Commissioners received another opinion from the Trumbull County Prosecutor's office, which stated that the building, as proposed, was not eligible, as construction services cannot be done through the cooperative purchasing program. Subsequently, the County Commissioners have pulled their support of construction of this building. Commissioner Cantalamessa was very apologetic, but it is still very disappointing. This has been a very long and time consuming project, and the county still has over 75,000 people who need vaccinated. This building would have served many more uses, such as PPE storage and distribution, and food distribution, as well as providing an adequate facility for our staff to administer vaccinations. Mr. Simon thanked Kathy Salapata for volunteering to help with this proposal, but unfortunately the project is dead. Mr. Biery thanked Mr. Simon for all his hard work and efforts on this project on behalf of the Board. Mrs. Salapata added that she also appreciated all of Mr. Simon's hard work, he did a tremendous job and felt that the building was needed. The staff also is doing a wonderful job, sometimes under less than great conditions.





Health Commissioner's Report – March 24, 2021 Board of Health Meeting

- 1) **Budget/Financial**
 - Attached is the monthly financial report for February 2021. The general fund is at a positive cash balance of \$332,565.22, and our all fund balance at \$2,661,327.24.
- 2) **Credit Card**
 - Quarterly update on the credit status has not changed.
 - For the credit card transactions, please see the list of bills.
- 3) **Vehicles**
 - Attached is the cost analysis for the month of January for the vehicles. The overall cost savings with the vehicles, for the month of January shows as a negative \$293.51, with a year to date savings of negative \$983.54. This negative cost savings is due to low vehicle mileage, as individuals are spending more time at vaccination clinics.

- 7) **COVID-19 (Coronavirus)**
 - We started using the state's new scheduling system, VMS, for the first time partially with our clinic held on March 10th. Jenna Amerine, Kris Kriebel and a representative from VMS were out at the fairgrounds on the 10th to oversee the process and check clients in for their vaccination. There were a few issues encountered during this clinic, such as spotty internet access, but all-in-all it went well. We also used the system to fully schedule our clinic held on March 18th. People were able to register themselves online, or if they did not have internet access, they were able to call into our office and we assisted them. This clinic opened up for 800 registrations on Thursday, March 11th, and was completely filled by the end of the day. Although it is still early, and there are a few things to still tweak, we feel that this new system will solve a lot of our ongoing scheduling issues.

Board of Health Report March 24, 2021 for February 2021

- TCCHD Nursing Division has conducted weekly community walk in and drive up COVID mass vaccination clinics. As of March 14, 2021, TCCHD has distributed approximately 19,986 doses of COVID vaccine in Trumbull County and of those, 13,795 are first doses and are 6,191 second doses. These clinics have been conducted in collaboration with community and Medical Reserve Corps volunteers. TCCHD is also collaborating with Direction Home of Eastern Ohio (formally Area Agency on Aging) and the Trumbull County Fire Departments to provide vaccines to the homebound population. Additionally, TCCHD is partnering with Oak Street Health to provide COVID vaccine to the underserved populations in Trumbull County. The Nursing division continues to do COVID case tracing and follow up.

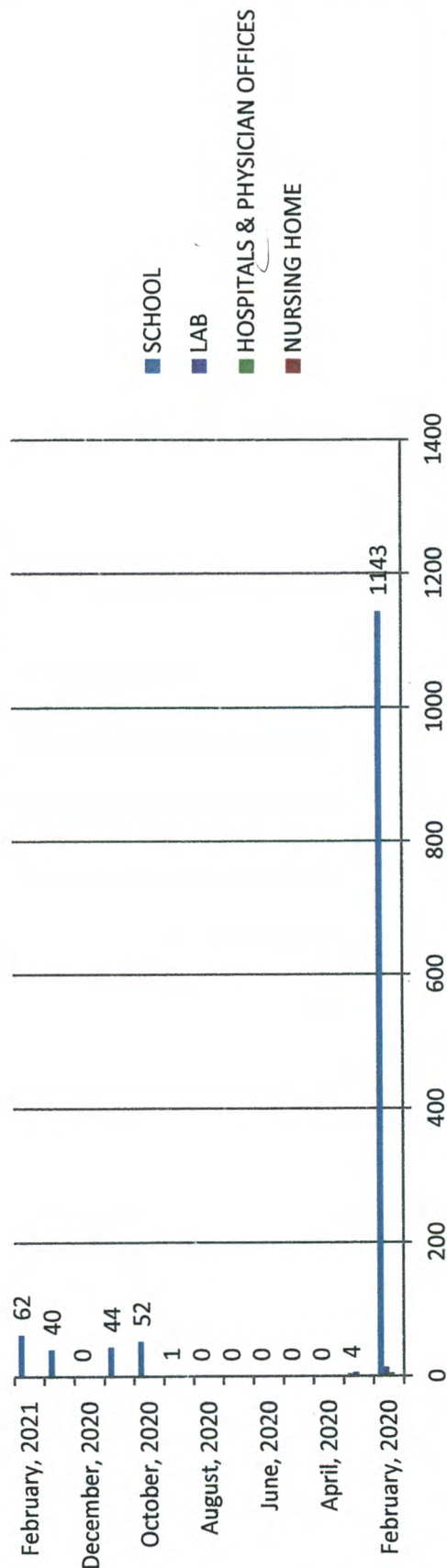

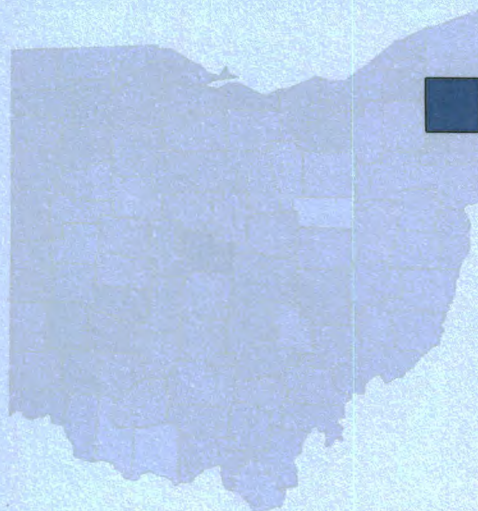

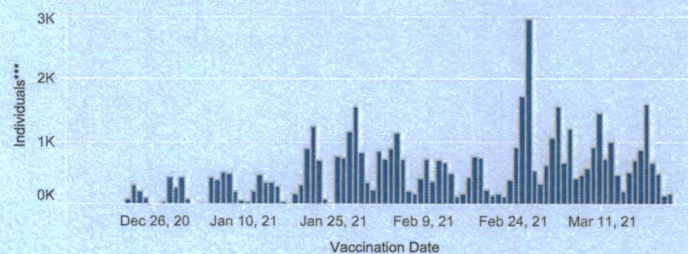
