- V. **Health Commissioner Report:** Mr. Migliozi presented a written report to the Board for their review. Mr. Migliozi also informed the Board that Trumbull County was over 70% in ages 65+ vaccinated, but we are behind in the younger age groups. The feeling is that the younger age groups are hesitant in getting the vaccine, and also that convenience of getting the vaccine is an issue. In order to try to make the vaccine more accessible, the health district's plan is to "take it to the streets". We will no longer be going and conducting first dose clinics at the Trumbull County Fairgrounds. Our goal will be to get into the workplaces and areas of need, holding clinics at different times and different days of the week.

X. **Board Report:** Mr. Simon stated that the use of the fairgrounds for the COVID-19 vaccination clinics during the inclement weather has left the grounds in need of repair. Someone has said that the use of COVID Cares Act funding for these repairs is not a proper use of these funds. Mr. Simon asked Mr. Migliozi if he saw any way for the county to use Cares Act funding for these repairs. Mr. Migliozi responded that the grant funding that the health district has received is deliverable based, and can only be expended for very specific uses, and he would have to look into it further to see if any of these grant monies could be used for those repairs, but he was not aware of any. The Cares Act funding that the townships and the county commissioners received is not as specific. Following additional discussion, Mr. Simon requested, and was granted, permission to work with the Board's legal counsel and Health Commissioner to look into the matter.

XII. **New Business:** A. Declaration of Unfit for Human Habitation – 323 W. Liberty St., Hubbard City, David Rhodes, Owner – Not present. A request was made by Hubbard City Officials to determine if the structure located at this address was fit for human habitation. An inspection was conducted on March 16, 2021, and upon inspection the sanitarian noted water damage, solid waste, mold & moisture contamination and gross unsanitary conditions.

B. Declaration of Unfit for Human Habitation – 155 Marshall, Champion Twp., Charles Dorsey, Owner – Not present. A request was made by Champion Township Zoning to determine if the structure on this property was fit for human habitation. An inspection was conducted on March 16, 2021, and upon inspection the sanitarian noted broken, missing or board windows and doors, the ceiling was in collapse, solid waste and gross unsanitary

conditions. The house is vacant, and through the windows the sanitarian could see that the structure is full of waste and in horrific condition.

Since that time, a new owner has obtained possession of the property and has made several repairs to the structure. On March 27, 2021, Warren Township stated that they were presented evidence showing that the conditions that were present at the time of the health department’s inspection have been corrected, and requested that the Board of Health rescind their declaration of unfit. A recent inspection by the environmental health staff concurs with the township’s findings.





Health Commissioner's Report – April 28, 2021 Board of Health Meeting

1) Budget/Financial

- Attached is the monthly financial report for March 2021. The general fund is at a positive cash balance of \$223,691.46, and our all fund balance at \$2,714,622.55.
- The audit for the 2019 & 2020 calendar years has begun. The state auditor's office has contracted out our audit, and it will be conducted by the certified public accountant firm of Charles E. Harris & Associates, Inc. This firm performed our 2017-2018 audit also. The cost of the audit is projected to be \$9,000.00; however, this may increase due to the fact that in 2020 we exceeded the \$750,000.00 threshold in federal grant monies, which may cause it to go from a 2-year audit to a 1-year audit and may change the "testing" methods that they need to conduct.

2) Credit Card

- Quarterly update on the credit status has not changed.
- For the credit card transactions, please see the list of bills.

3) Vehicles

- Attached is the cost analysis for the month of March for the vehicles. The overall cost savings with the vehicles, for the month of March was \$193.31, with a year to date savings of negative \$790.23. This negative cost savings is due to low vehicle mileage, as individuals are spending more time at vaccination clinics.

4) Building/Grounds

- As some of you may have noticed, the entrance to the basement is in poor condition. We have put a request into "Facility Dude", which is the county's maintenance request to have them look into repairing it. As you will notice, the brick wall is bowing and pulling away from the concrete, and the ceiling above is rusting. I will keep you abreast of the situation, should the county agree to making the needed repairs.

7) COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

- We are continuing to use the state's scheduling system, VMS, for our clinics that we are holding out at the fairgrounds. The scheduling system is working well, and has also cut down on some of the data entry time required to be completed after the clinics. Over the last couple of weeks, we have noticed a drastic decline in the amount of people registering and attending our clinics. We attribute that to multiple factors, there are more providers offering the vaccinations, many in our elderly population have already received the vaccine, and the state has lowered the age group and most who still need the vaccine in that age group cannot attend a clinic during work hours. We are attempting to address this decline, by working with the Regional Chamber of Commerce and reaching out to our local businesses to hold clinics within their facilities for their employees and families. We are also going to be offering more evening and Saturday clinics, with our first evening clinic being held at the fairgrounds on Thursday, April 22nd. Additionally, we will be working with faith based organizations and other stakeholders in targeted zip code areas, based upon demographic data, to improve access to vaccine in those areas of disparity, as outlined by the Ohio Department of Health. This will also assist in compliance with a new vaccine equity grant recently awarded.

Board of Health Report April 28, 2021 for March 2021

- TCCHD Nursing Division has conducted weekly community walk in and drive up COVID mass vaccination clinics. As of April 14, 2021, TCCHD has distributed approximately 26,707 doses of COVID vaccine in Trumbull County and of those, 15,465 are first doses and are 11,242 second doses. These clinics have been conducted in collaboration with community and Medical Reserve Corps volunteers. TCCHD is also collaborating with Direction Home of Eastern Ohio (formally Area Agency on Aging) and the Trumbull County Fire Departments to provide vaccines to the homebound population. However, this has been suspended until further notice on the safety and us of the J&J COVID vaccine. Additionally, TCCHD is partnering with Oak Street Health to provide COVID vaccine to the underserved populations in Trumbull County, and will begin to vaccinate businesses. The Nursing division continues to do COVID case tracing and follow up.

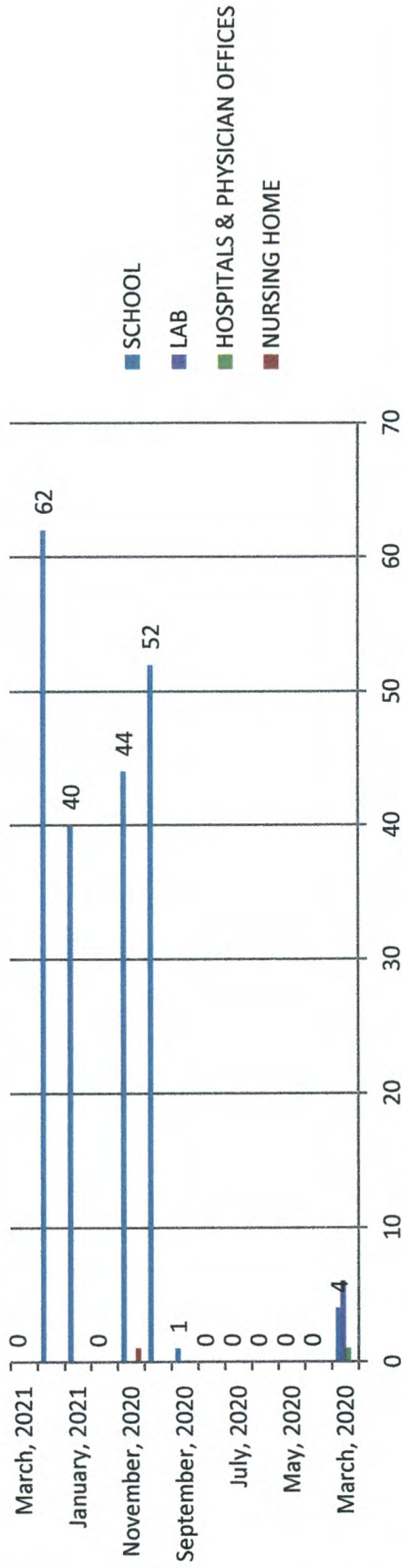
