**IV. Health Commissioner Report:** Effective July 1, 2019, the Early Intervention Program will transition over to the Trumbull County Board of Developmental Disabilities. Kenya Franklin, Beth Shelar and Kristyn Bugnone, who are the three employees who will be transferring to TCBDD, were in attendance at the meeting. Mr. Migliozi thanked Mrs. Franklin, Mrs. Shelar and Mrs. Bugnone for their service to the health district, and stated that they were an asset to our agency, and would surely be an asset to TCBDD. Mr. Biery thanked them on behalf of the Board, and wished them well. Mr. Migliozi informed the Board that to fill the vacancy in the home visiting program, one of our other staff members is getting credentialed, and Mrs. Swann is getting her supervisor credentials.

A meeting was held on June 19, 2019, with the Newton Falls officials to discuss issues they are having in their village regarding food service operations. They felt that more frequent inspections should be conducted on food service operations in their village, and wanted to conduct them themselves. It was explained that they would not be permitted to do that per state rules, and they then questioned about creating their own health district. It was explained that, as a village, they were required to be under a general health district, and other issues, such as accreditation and health district requirements were explained and discussed. They understood, and it was stated to them that if they saw something that they felt needed to be addressed in a food establishment, they could file a complaint and we would send a sanitarian out to inspect.

Mr. Migliozi informed the Board that a quote for engineering services obtained for the basement renovations, and asked the Board if they wished to pursue moving forward on the basement. A representative from Equitas Healthcare approached the health district to discuss a drug called Prep HIV, which is a prevention drug. There has been an uptick with regard to diseases, such as HIV, due to IV drug use. The first of the four CHIP meetings will be held on June 27, 2019. Mr. Wilster & Mr. Migliozi met with Warren Township officials regarding removal of dams in their jurisdiction, and their concerns were shared with Eastgate Regional Council of Governments and the EPA. The written report of the 2017-2018 audit was received, and Mr. Migliozi will update the Board of those findings at the next meeting.

Mr. Messersmith asked what triggered the meeting with the Newton Falls officials. Mr. Wilster stated that one bad restaurant triggered their request, and they were informed that if they see something, to say something, and an inspector would be sent out. It was questioned as to what our health district would be doing regarding HIV, and what the next step was since the meeting with Equitas Healthcare. Mr. Migliozi responded that they were looking to address this in the

CHIP, and that they were not just looking to distribute Prep through the community, but it was more than that. Mrs. Swann added that the Warren City Health District has the STD test site, and hopefully the Prep can be distributed through their clinic.

Mr. Biery asked for a motion on the engineering services for the basement. Mr. Dubos made motion to have a bid proposal written and to accept bids for engineering services, with a second by Mr. Borazc. Mr. Biery questioned as to whether the building committee was aware of this need. Mr. Migliozi stated that they were not. It was thought that the renovations would be under \$50,000.00, but was just notified yesterday that it would not, and that is why the committee was unaware of this request. Following discussion, the motion was rescinded pending further analysis of the matter.

B. Purchase/Replacement of Vehicle – While onsite conducting an inspection, someone ran into one of our vehicles, and due to the damage, the insurance company has indicated that it will be totaled. Two estimates were received from Mark Thomas Ford, the dealership that we purchased our previous vehicles. One estimate was for a new 2020 Ford Fusion, at a cost of \$18,124.70, and the other was for a used 2017 Ford Focus Hatchback, at a cost of \$14,000.00. Mr. Wilster recommended the 2020 Ford Fusion, feeling it was a better vehicle and new. Atty. Kokor stated that he was negotiating with the insurance company for a better replacement value for the totaled vehicle, and that he was waiting to hear back from the adjuster.

C. Purchase of a Truck – The 2007 Chevy Blazer that we currently own is beginning to show its wear, and we would respectfully request approval to purchase a truck to replace this vehicle. The purchase was requested of a truck for the construction & demolition debris inspections, and a vehicle capable to pull the health district trailer, in addition to other uses. An estimate was obtained from Mark Thomas Ford, which is where our other vehicles have been purchased, for a Ford F150 truck, at a cost of \$30,100.60, but using the trade in value of the Blazer, which is \$3,000.00, this would take that cost down to \$27,100.60. This vehicle is being offered with the state government concessions, will be available in October, and be paid for entirely out of the construction & demolition debris fund. Atty. Kokor stated that he had contacted Sims Buick, and they are going to supply a bid on a truck that they have available also. Mr. Simon suggested that the Blazer be placed on GovDeals for a minimum of \$3,000.00 to see if a higher price could be obtained for the vehicle.

It is respectfully requested that the Board pass a resolution authorizing the delegation and usage of credit cards.

**BY: THE TRUMBULL COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE TRUMBULL COUNTY COMBINED HEALTH DISTRICT**

**RE: Trumbull County Board of Health Authorization and Policy Relating to Delegation and Usage of Credit Cards**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of the Trumbull County Combined Health District recognizes the value of an efficient method of payment and record keeping for certain expenses, and further authorizes the use of credit cards; and

**WHEREAS**, the authorization, handling and use of credit cards has been established to provide a convenient and efficient means to purchase goods and services from vendors; and

**WHEREAS**, the credit cards however, may not be used to circumvent the general purchasing procedures established by state law and health district fiscal policy. The Board affirms that the credit cards shall only be used in connection with Board approved or health district related activities and that only those types of expenses that are for the benefit of the health district and serve a valid and proper public purpose shall be paid for by credit card; and

**WHEREAS**, the Health Commissioner shall develop administrative guidelines that specify those employees authorized to use credit cards, the amount of expenses which can be paid by credit card, and their proper supervision and use; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, the Board of Health recognizes the convenience and efficiency afforded by the use of a Health District credit card(s). Credit cards however, shall not be used in order to circumvent the general purchasing procedures established by state law and health district fiscal policy; and

**RESOLVED**, the Board of Health grants Trumbull County Combined Health District the authority to forego standard procurement requirements for needs arising from unforeseen causes. In cases involving the welfare of the public, extreme weather conditions, or officially declared emergencies, the Health Commissioner may grant exceptions to this policy; and

**RESOLVED**, the Board of Health authorizes the Health Commissioner to develop administrative guidelines regarding the delegation and use of credit cards, and further authorizes the Health Commissioner the authority to issue credit cards.

**Section 1.** If any section, sentence, or provision of this resolution shall be held or deemed to be invalid for any reason, that invalidity shall not affect the validity of any other part of this resolution which can be given effect without such invalid part or parts;

**Section 2.** The Board of Health finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in those formal actions were in meeting open to the public in compliance with the law, including Section 121.22 of the Revised Code.

I. Variance Request – Pauline R. Jackamo – 5975 Youngstown Hubbard Rd., Hubbard Twp. – Not present. Ms. Jackamo is in the process of selling her property and the new buyer will be using the structure as storage that will yield little sewage. This area is slated to be sewered, and Ms. Jackamo is requesting a variance from the semi-public sewage treatment system rules that would allow a holding tank on the property to collect the sewage until sanitary sewers are completed. The OEPA allows a holding tank, as long as it is portable and will hold 500 gallons or less sewage, with Board of Health approval.

Occupancy of the building shall not take place until the plumbing fixtures are properly plumbed to the holding tank, passes inspection and the holding tank has been inspected by the health district. This variance will transfer to any and all future owners upon change of title.

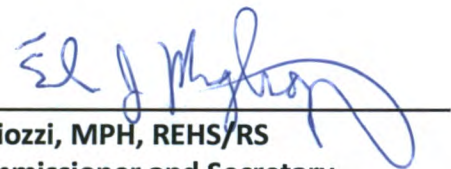

## Health Commissioner's Report – June 26, 2019 Board of Health Meeting

### 1) Budget/Financial

- Attached is the monthly financial report for May. The general fund shows a positive cash balance of \$507,567.09 with our all fund balance at \$1,819,654.96

### 2) Time Study

- Attached is my time study for the month of May. The bulk of my time was spent on administrative issues and accreditation.

### 3) Vehicles

- Attached is the cost analysis for the month of May for the vehicles. The overall cost savings with the vehicles, for the month of May, was \$1,729.83, with a year to date savings of \$7,597.36.

### 4) Hepatitis A Outbreak (As of 6/3/19)

- There have been 2,997 cases, and the outbreak is now in 79 counties in Ohio.
- 60% of those cases have been hospitalized, and there have now been ten deaths.
- There have been 53,950 doses of vaccine distributed to 111 local health departments that have requested vaccine.

### 5) Legionella Outbreak

- The Franklin County Public Health is investigating a Legionella Outbreak, with a total of ten confirmed cases.
- There have been ten hospitalized, and one death.

### 6) Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA)

- The CHNA full public release occurred on June 6, 2019, 8:30 AM, at Kent State University Trumbull Branch.
- We had hoped to have more community involvement, but it was well attended, and we received a lot of good feedback from those in attendance.
- The Community Health Improvement Plan meeting is scheduled for June 27, 2019.

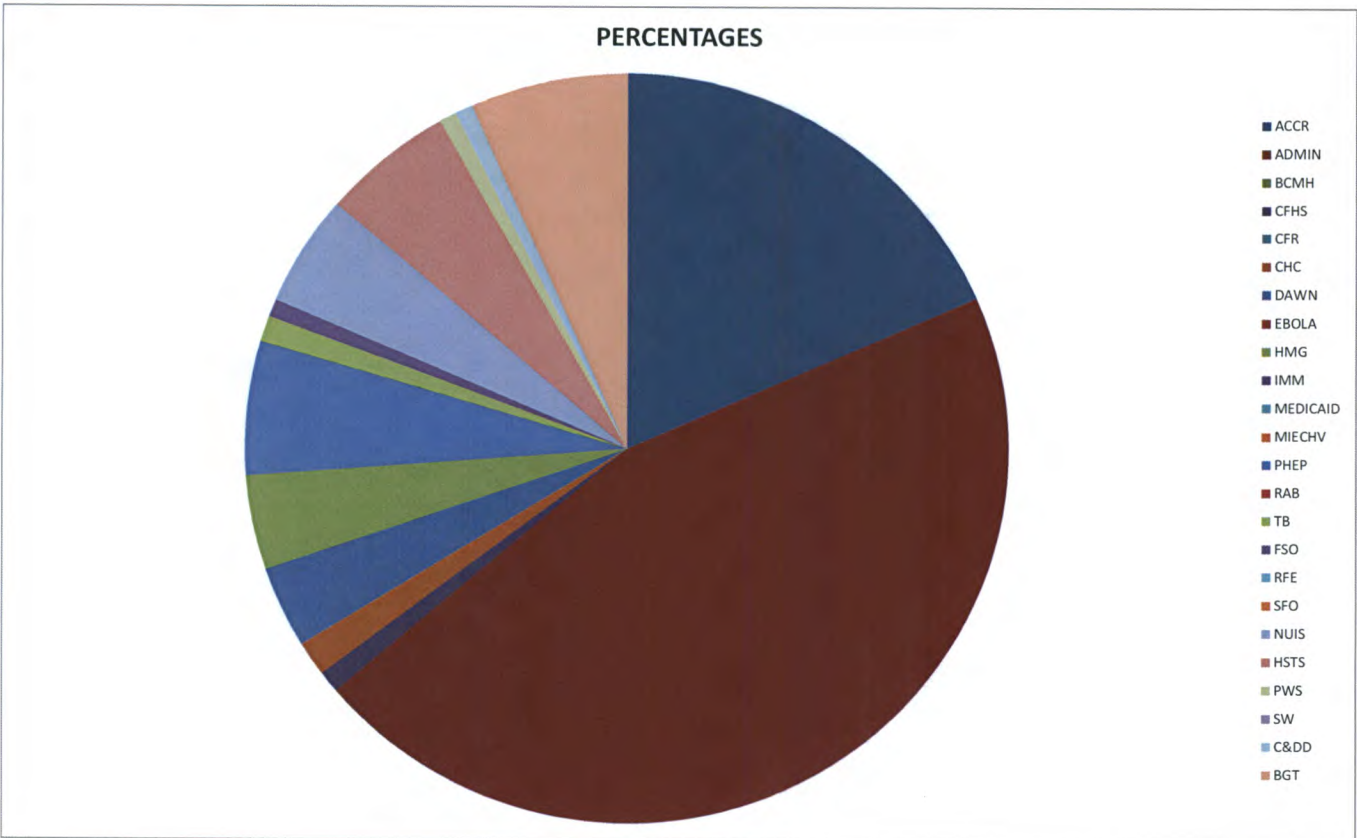

**Board of Health Report June 26, 2019 for May 2019**

- Nursing division received 3 Notice of Awards for grants: Get Vaccinated Ohio - \$57,759.00; Public Health Emergency Preparedness - \$143,265.00 and Tobacco Use Prevention and Cessation Program - \$100,000.00. We did not get funded for the Mom's Quit for Two program.
- As of week ending June 3, 2019, Ohio has 2997 confirmed Hepatitis A cases associated with the multi-state outbreak; age range 1 to 89 years old; 60% of the cases are male; 1,796 cases have been hospitalized and there are now 10 deaths. These cases are spread between 79 Ohio counties. ODH has shipped 53,950 doses of Hepatitis A vaccine to these counties.
- Home visitors assess the families they are serving two times a year. Attached are the results of the survey that was conducted in May 2019.
- Attached is a copy of the overdose report for May 2019.
- Attached is the May 2019 Project DAWN report, Influenza report and Animal Bite report.

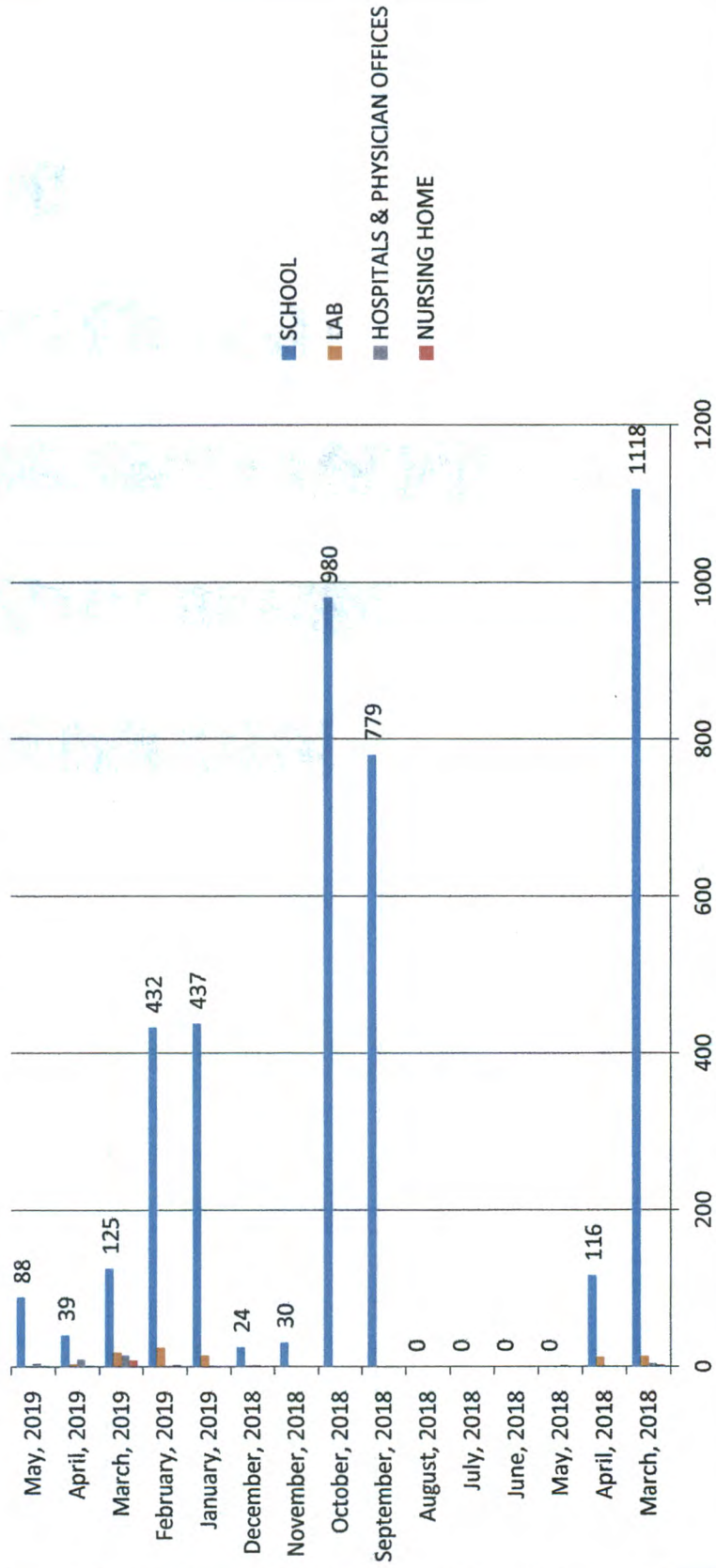

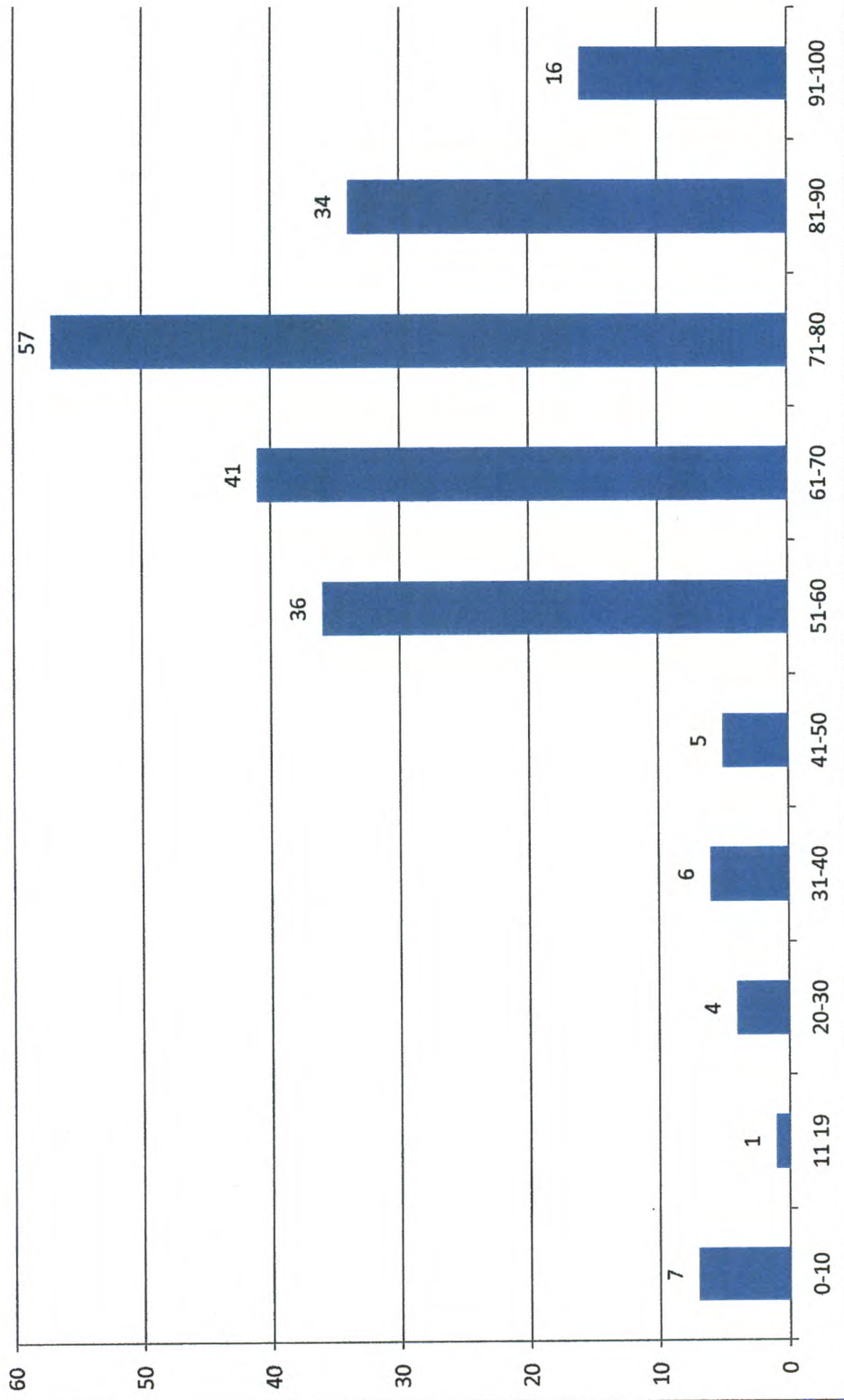

There were 64 total overdoses for May which was a slight decrease from April when there were 77. I am still seeing a mix of Cocaine and Fentanyl as well as an increase in Methamphetamine in our toxicology reports. There were also 3 overdose deaths that were caused by Methamphetamine alone when reviewing the 2019 deaths. Ranee is now able to include Steward's numbers and demographics to her cumulative report because Steward is integrated, once again, with EPI Center.

Figure 1. A monthly count of emergency departments visits due to overdoses in Trumbull County by Zip Codes. There were 64 overdoses during the month of May.

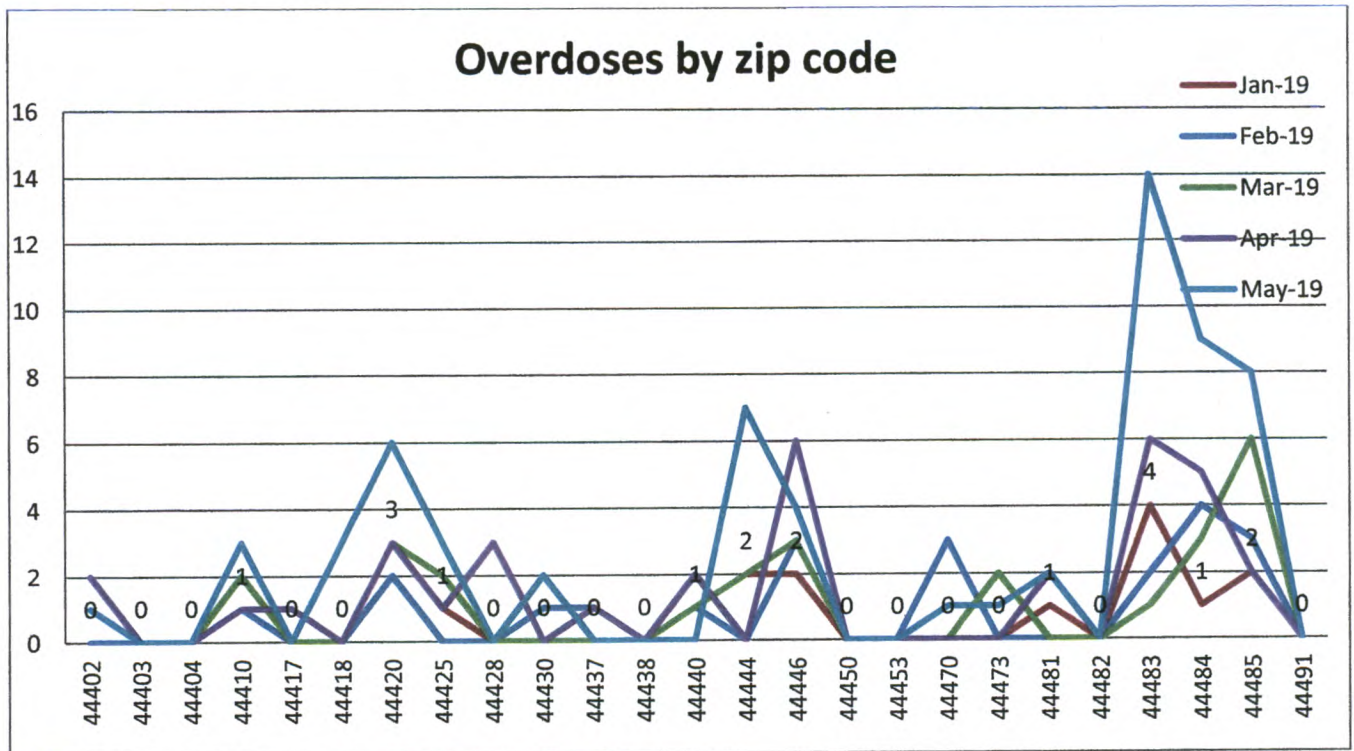




Figure 2. Gender distribution of overdose-related ED visits; Trumbull County; May 2019

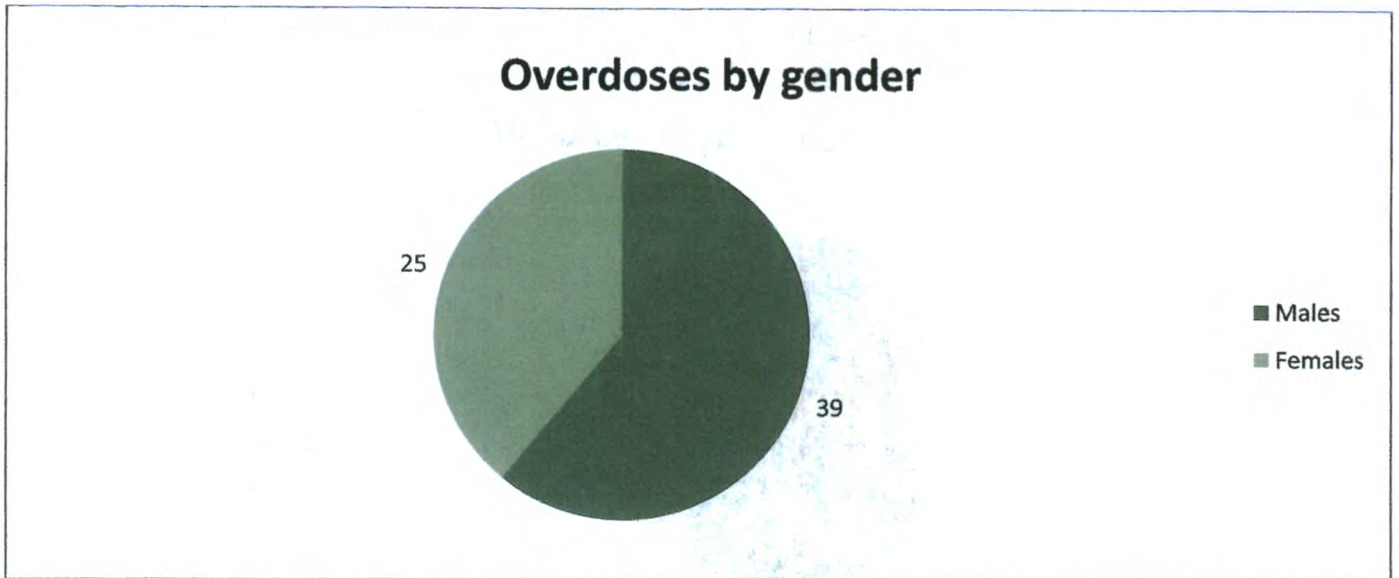
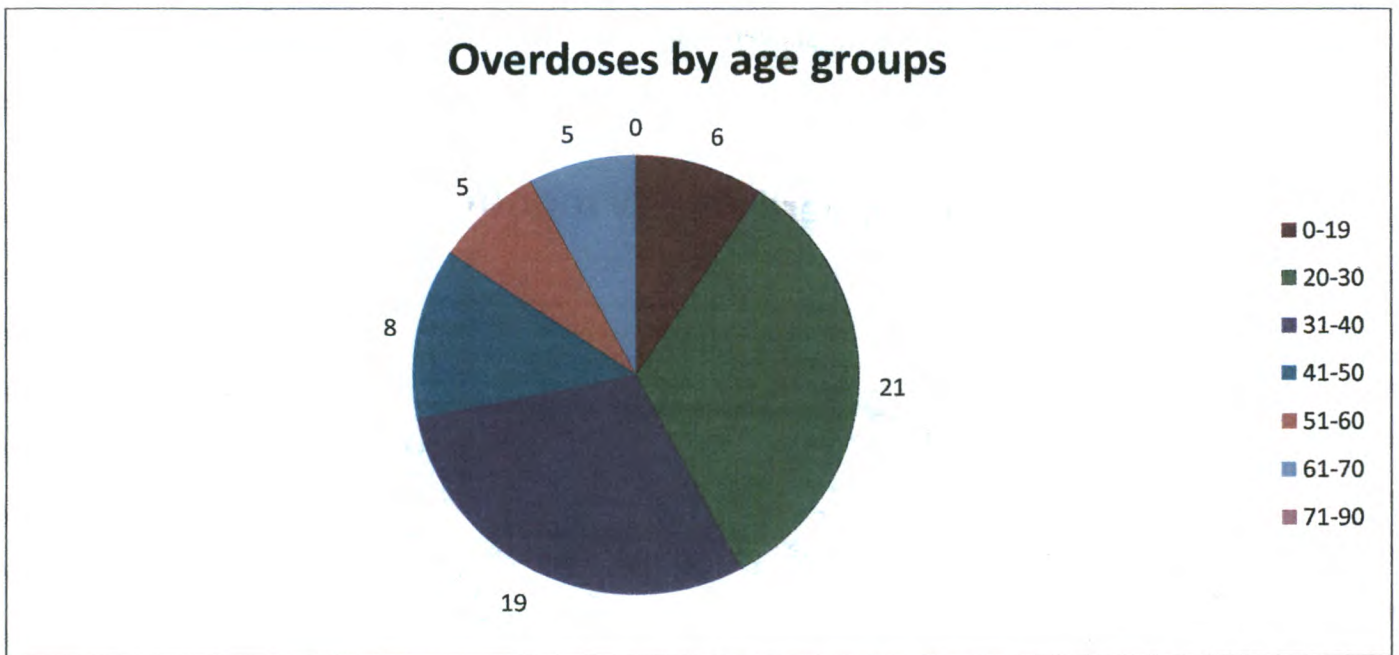


Figure 3. Age distribution of overdose related ED visits; Trumbull County; May 2019

Figure 4. The days of the week that the overdoses occurred in Trumbull County; May 2019.

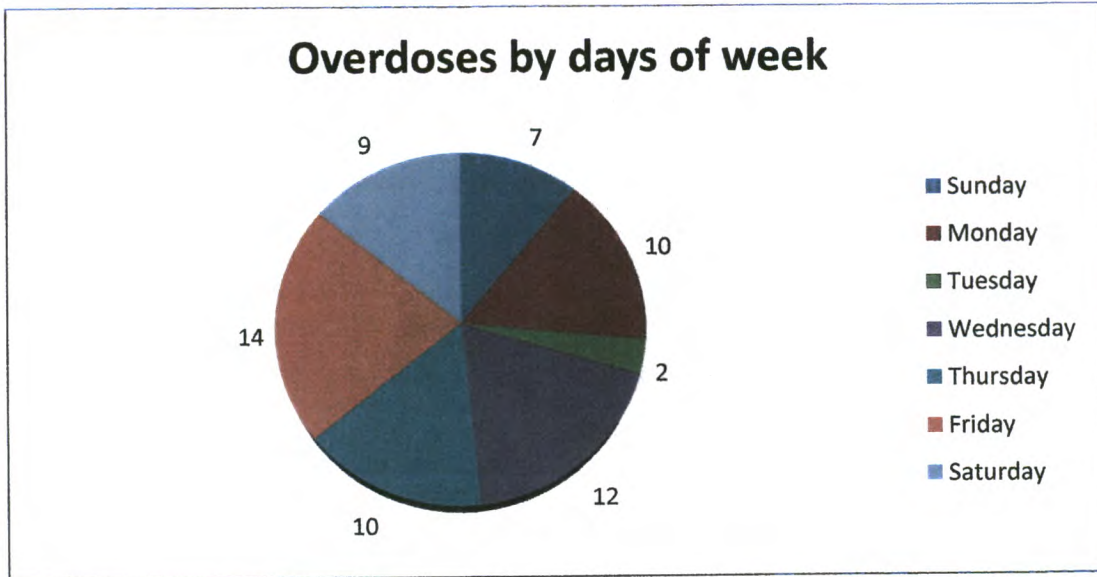
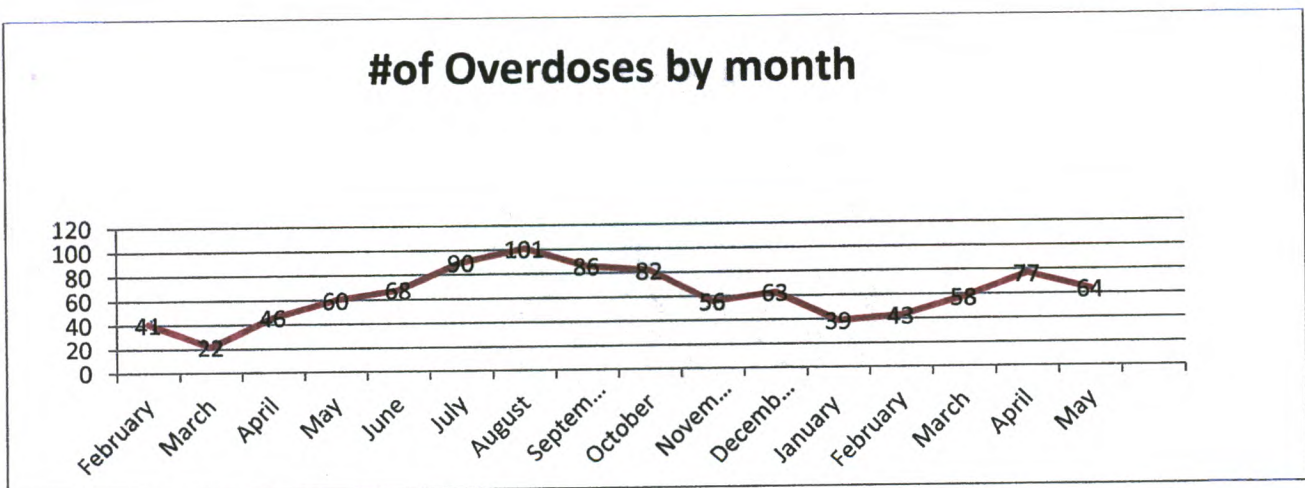


Figure 5. Chart of total overdoses from January 2018- May 2019

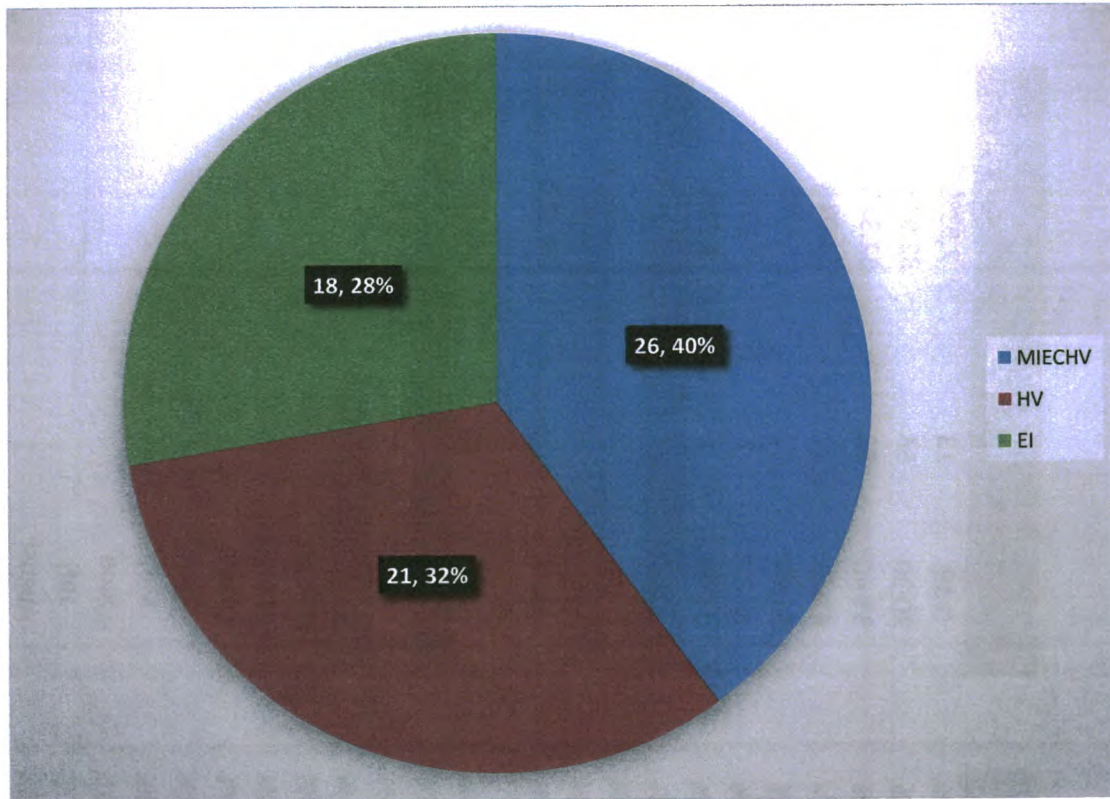

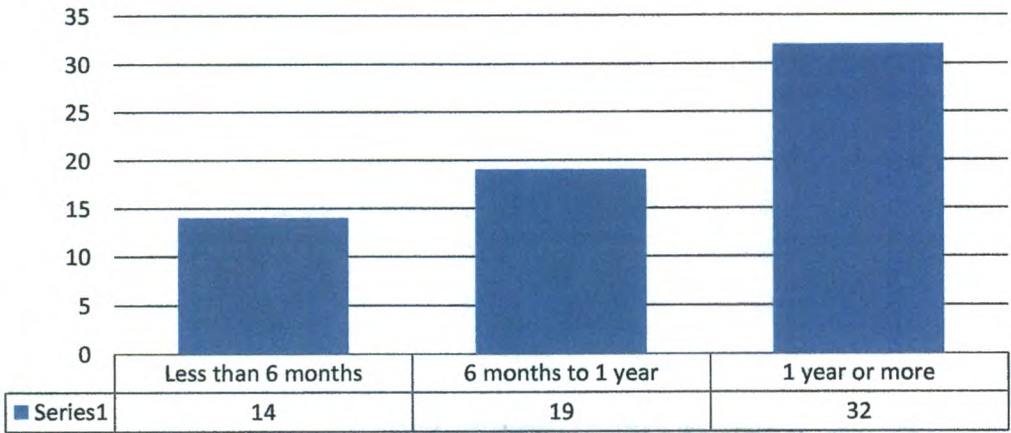

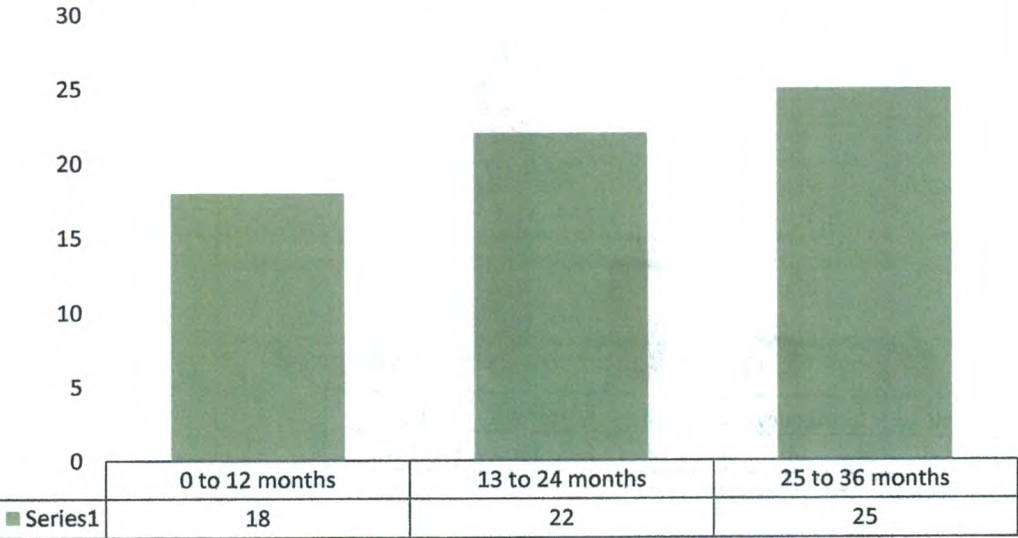

**How long have you worked with a home visitor?**



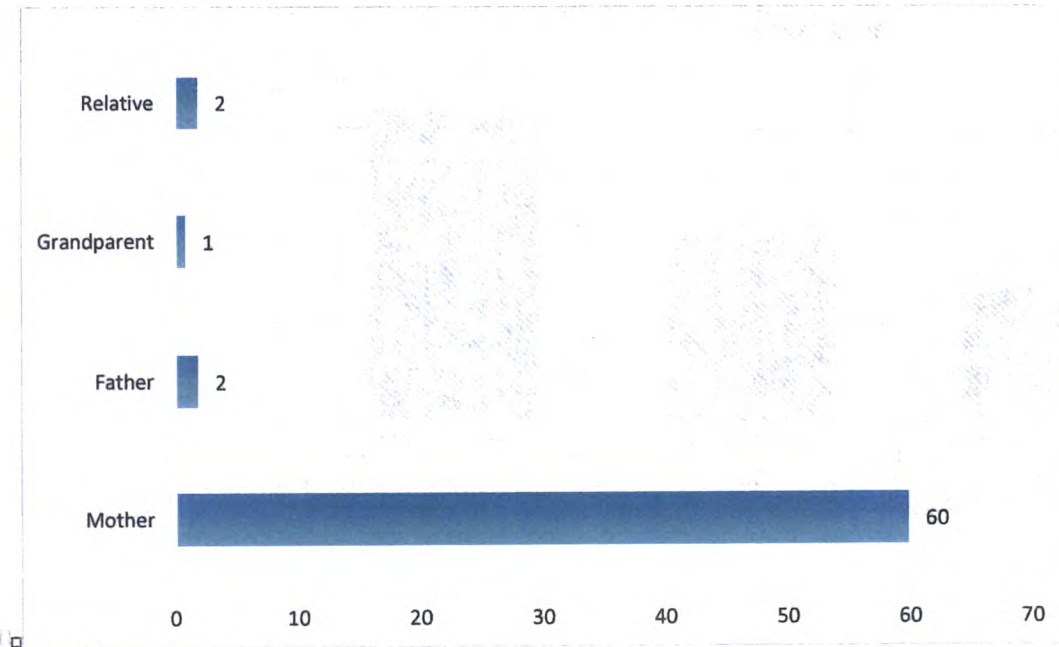
