Mr. Migliozzi added that the COVID case counts have risen for two straight weeks, with the current weekly case count at 108, which is the highest that the numbers have been since the pandemic ended in May. The CDC has elevated Trumbull County from low to moderate, due to increased hospitalizations. Our epidemiologist will continue to monitor the COVID numbers. The bridge program for the COVID vaccines has ended, and the bivalent vaccine is no longer allowed to be used. We are now using the monovalent vaccine, which is specific for the XVD variant, and that is the only vaccine that is to be used. We did apply for VFC vaccine, which is vaccine for uninsured and underinsured people, and are in the process of working with our vaccine company, Vaxcare, to purchase some adult vaccine, which is for ages 12 and up, to provide to the public. We do have a number of clinics scheduled for flu and COVID.



Health Commissioner's Report - September 27, 2023 Board of Health Meeting

1) Budget/Financial

- Attached are the monthly financial reports for August 2023. The general fund was at a positive cash balance of \$931,035.35, and our all fund balance was at \$3,275,229.81.
- Taxes were received in the amount of \$215,192.48.

2) Credit Card

- Two of the three credit cards have been renewed, and will expire in 2027. The remaining credit card will expire in November of this year. The monthly credit limit remains the same, at \$5,000.00
- For the credit card transactions, please see the list of bills.

3) Vehicles

- Attached is the cost analysis for the month of August 2023 for the vehicles. The overall cost savings with the vehicles, for the month of August was \$3,689.80, with YTD savings of \$18,089.52.
- We have indicated to Montrose Ford that we would take the 2023 Ford Escape that is set for "build". As soon as I received any further information regarding a delivery date, I will let the Board know.

4) Building/Grounds

- Farmer's Bank did accept our bid of \$550,000.00 for the former Cortland Bank Building in Cortland, Ohio, and we are set to close on October 1, 2023.
- The 911 center is interested in using the second floor of the building. Arrangements for the use of that floor are being discussed.
- We have met with various contractors/vendors, (i.e. plumbing, HVAC, flooring, cubicles, signage, moving company, etc.) and are moving forward with plans for the move. Our scheduled move in date is December 4, 2023.

7) COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

- On 9/15/23, we received notification from ODH that they were deactivating the coronoavirus.ohio.gov
 website and activating a new ODH website for COVID-19 content. With the changeover, ODH will no
 longer be providing statistics on case rates for counties.
- As of 9/17/23, our current case count was at 108, at my last report it was at 26.
- ODH issued a press release on August 31, 2023, stated that they had confirmed that the COVID-19 variant BA.2.86 had been detected in one case in Lorain County. Currently, there is no evidence that this variant is causing any more severe illness, but Ericka Clarke, our epidemiologist is monitoring for cases in Trumbull County.

8) Accreditation

- We continue to meet monthly to select appropriate documents to demonstrate our compliance to PHAB's standards and measures, as well as we continue to conduct quarterly evaluations of our performance management, quality improvement, workforce develop and our strategic plans.
- We are actively working on the annual report to PHAB, which is due by the end of the year.

9) Other

Through our mosquito surveillance program, we were informed by ODH that Trumbull County had one
mosquito pool test positive for West Nile Virus. This mosquito pool was from a baseball field on Spencer
Street in Newton Falls. To date, there have been no human cases of West Nile Virus in Trumbull County. A
press release was issued on 9/12/23 notifying the public, along with prevention information.

Board of Health Report September 27, 2023 for July and August 2023

- Attached is the data for Trumbull County's Pertussis cases as of September 16, 2023. There have been 2 additional
 cases to this data. TCCHD will continue to monitor until there are no cases in six weeks, which is two incubation
 periods. Families continue to attend the West Farmington clinic to receive Dtap. TCCHD administered 14 Dtap
 and 2 Tdap at the July clinic; and 4 Dtap and 5 Tdap at the August clinic.
- On September 11, 2023, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved new 2023-2024 COVID-19 mRNA vaccines, targeted against the currently circulating Omicron sub variant XBB.1.5, for all individuals 12 years of age and older and authorized under emergency use mRNA vaccines in individuals 6 months through 11 years of age.
 ODH has advised TCCHD to immediately stop using all bivalent mRNA COVID-19 Pfizer and Moderna vaccine.
- TCCHD Epidemiologist, Ericka Clark has noticed an increase in Lyme Disease cases. Attached is a comparison chart
 for 2022 and 2023. Lyme Disease prevention information has been continually posted on TCCHD's social media
 to make the public aware.
- Attached is a copy of the overdose report, the Project DAWN report, the Influenza report and the Animal Bite report for July and August 2023.
