







The Save Our Sight (SOS) Program was established in 1999 to provide early detection of vision problems and the promotion of good eye health and safety in Ohio's children. All local programs funded through SOS are free and service children in all 88 counties in Ohio. Ohio vehicle owners may donate \$1 to the SOS Fund when applying for or renewing their motor vehicle registrations.

Families can apply for free protective eyewear for youth sports and school activities to prevent eye injuries. Families of children diagnosed with Amblyopia (lazy eye) to get support and free patches from the Ohio Amblyope Registry.

Educators can apply for free protective eyewear for youth sports and school activities to prevent eye injuries. Health Professionals and Educators who work with children can request free eye health and safety programs for their schools or community organizations. Health Professionals and Educators can receive free training and equipment for vision screening children.
