With warmer weather on the way, the TCCHD wants you to "Bite Back: and Stay Safe from Mosquitos and Ticks" with these tips:



## **PRACTICE THE 4 Ds: MOSOUITO PROTECTION**



1. DRAIN Drain standing water from items around your home, yard, and business.



Use an EPA registered insect repellent when outdoors. Make sure door and window screens fit tightly with no holes.



3. DAWN TO DUSK
Protect yourself from
morning to night, especially
during prime times for
mosquito activity.



Wear long sleeves, pants, and close toed shoes when outdoors to cover your skin.

## PRACTICE THE STEPS: TICK PROTECTION



1. DRESS
Wear long sleeves,
pants, and closed toe
shoes when outdoors
to cover your skin.



Use insect repellent when outdoors and avoid tick habitats.



Check your entire body for ticks after being outdoors, including your children and pets.



4. REMOVE
Use fine-tipped
weezers to promptly
remove ticks.

## A Message from the TCCHD regarding the importance of and purpose of public health regulations.

As many of you have seen in previous versions of The Trumbull County Combined Health District Newsletter, we ALWAYS offer a segment known as

"TCCHD Industry News
Keeping Trumbull County Safe and Healthy one step at a time!",

This segment was introduced as a means to demonstrate the volume of work the TCCHD does on a monthly basis. However, the question has been raised as to why we do (or what is the purpose of) these inspections and services we offer. So, the TCCHD wanted to provide the purpose behind these inspections and services so all the Trumbull County residents that use these services have a better understanding.

<u>Food Inspections</u> – These are performed to mitigate the public's possible exposure to foodborne illness which is highly preventable if the right steps are taken.

<u>Point of Sale/Real Estate Inspections</u> – These inspections are performed to prevent raw and poorly treated sewage from entering and contaminating surface and ground waters, resulting in human illness.

<u>Plumbing Inspections</u> – These inspections ensure proper drainage of water and wastewater from households and businesses while preventing sewage odors from entering the household

Even well cared for, healthy animals can have germs that can make people sick. Follow these key steps to have a safe and fun animal-visiting experience.



Do not enter the barn if you feel sick. Your germs can also make animals sick.



Leave food, drinks, strollers, and pacifiers out of animal areas.



Don't kiss or snuggle with the animals. Closely supervise young children to make sure they don't put anything in their mouths.



Avoid touching your face while in the barns. This is one way germs can get into your body and make you sick.



Wash your hands with soap and water, after visiting with the animals.
