Covid-19 Vaccine Clinics

The TCCHD has been and continues to work diligently against the Covid-19 virus and Pandemic within Trumbull County. Throughout the month of November, the TCCHD will hold Covid-19 vaccination clinics throughout all of Trumbull County. Please contact the Nursing division of the TCCHD at 330-675-2489 for details about those clinics. All 3 vaccinations (Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson) are generally available. Covid-19 booster shots are also available!

Covid-19 Testing

Currently the TCCHD has a number of over the counter and home Covid-19 test kits. Anyone interested in receiving at home/over the counter test kits should reach out to the nursing division of the TCCHD at 330-675-2489. Meanwhile, if possible continue to mask, maintain safe distance from others, wash your hands, and get vaccinated. These measures will help protect you from COVID-19.

Covid-19 Data

As of October 17th, 2022:

- The TCCHD has administered approximately 43,042 doses of the Covid-19 Vaccine.
- 20,921 are first doses,
 - 17,832 are second doses,
- **3,419** are monovalent first booster doses, **532** are monovalent second booster doses, and **338** are bivalent boosters (original and Omicron),
- 365 doses of the COVID vaccine have been administered since the last board meeting,
- The TCCHD uses *the CDC Covid-19 Community Levels tool* to recommend what prevention steps to take. Levels can be Low, Medium, or High.
- Currently, Trumbull County, Ohio is Medium.
- <u>Prevention steps include:</u> Staying up-to-date with Covid-19 vaccines, getting tested if you have symptoms, and if you are at a high risk for severe illness, talk to your healthcare provider about whether or not to wear a mask and take other precautions.
- As of 10/24/2022, Trumbull County currently has a case rate of 166.7 per 100,000, and a
 positivity rate of 10.2%.

Recently, Trumbull County was downgraded from High to Medium on the CDC Community Level Tool. A step in the right direction! With this reduction it is still important to remember that one of the primary prevention steps for reducing the spread of Covid-19 is testing. The TCCHD (as stated above) has tests available for the general public. Please remember that if you are sick with Covid-19 symptoms, and (or) test positive for Covid-19, you should stay home and isolate yourself for five days from the time of symptom manifestation.

Young Lungs at Play!

When it comes to children and their potential exposure to tobacco and vaping these three ladies are not playing around! While personally witnessing some individuals smoking at a youth baseball game, Julie Callen of the TCCHD knew something had to be done and she knew right where to go. Enlisting the help of fellow coworkers Terry Merrick (RN) who works on Tobacco Cessation at the TCCHD, and Lindsay Adams (RN) the TCCHD's unofficial graphic designer, the three worked together to develop eye catching signage to be posted in areas, letting visitors know the area is now "Smoke and Tobacco Free"! The signs aptly named (Young Lungs at Play) immediately drew attention, and at the time of publication, these signs have been placed in 14 different communities, including recreational parks in Leavittsburg and Lordstown. The first order of 100 signs was gone within a matter of weeks, and the need for more has grown 3 fold, meaning 300 more were ordered. These signs are sure to fly out the TCCHD doors to a new home letting everyone know that Young Lungs are indeed...at play, and have no room for exposure to both tobacco and(or) vaping. Well done to all involved in this endeavor and keep it going!
