

Covid-19 Vaccine Clinics

The TCCHD has been and continues to work diligently against the Covid-19 virus and Pandemic within Trumbull County. Throughout the month of April, the TCCHD will hold Covid-19 vaccination clinics throughout all of Trumbull County. Please contact the Nursing division of the TCCHD at 330-675-2489 for details about those clinics. All vaccinations (Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson, etc.) are generally available. Covid-19 booster shots are also available!

Covid-19 Testing

Currently the TCCHD has a number of over the counter and home Covid-19 test kits. Anyone interested in receiving at home/over the counter test kits should reach out to the nursing division of the TCCHD at 330-675-2489. Meanwhile, if possible continue to mask, maintain safe distance from others, wash your hands, and get vaccinated. These measures will help protect you from COVID-19.

Covid-19 Data

As of March 1st, 2023:

- The TCCHD has administered approximately 43,494 doses of the Covid-19 Vaccine.
- **20,936** are first doses,
- 17,859 are second doses,
- **3,426** are monovalent first booster doses, **532** are monovalent second booster doses, and **741** are bivalent boosters (original and Omicron),
- 57 doses of the COVID vaccine have been administered since the last board meeting,
- The TCCHD uses *the CDC Covid-19 Community Levels tool* to recommend what prevention steps to take. Levels can be Low, Medium, or High.
- Currently, Trumbull County, Ohio is Medium.
- Prevention steps include:

Staying up-to-date with Covid-19 vaccines, getting tested if you have symptoms, and if you are at a high risk for severe illness, talk to your healthcare provider about whether or not to wear a mask and take other precautions.

 As of 3/20/2023, Trumbull County has a case rate of 120.7 per 100,000, and a positivity rate of 7.8%.

- 1. The Environmental division for January of 2023:
 - i. Performed **155** Food Service Operations Inspections,
 - ii. 160 Real Estate Evaluations,
 - iii. 191 Residential Sewage inspections,
 - iv. And 104 Plumbing Inspections.
- 2. The Nursing division for January of 2023:
 - Held 2 children immunization clinics and saw 5 clients,
 - Held 1 adult immunization clinic and saw 9 clients,
 - iii. Had **53** families enrolled in their home visiting program and provided **48** tele/home visits.
- 3. The TCCHD continues to offer Mail-Order Narcan Kits. Please contact Kathy Parrilla for more details. In fact, for January and February of 2023, 136 kits have been distributed, with 92 being mail order, and for all of 2022, 654 were distributed, with 131 being mail order. A greater Culture of Quality is alive and well within the TCCHD!

In the month of January 2023, the TCCHD once again partook in the QI maturity Survey to measure employee understanding of quality improvement (QI) within the agency. Based upon the 2023 results and when compared to the same survey taken in 2022, TCCHD administration is very proud to announce that across the board there was an aggregate increase of 36% in employee understanding of QI. This is a step in the right direction, and a direct reflection of TCCHD staff's willingness and dedication to creating and maintaining a greater culture of quality within the TCCHD. Some of the more notable increases from the survey that the administration wanted to share included:

- Staff share information across teams and work units, (up 50%),
- My work unit/team collects customer satisfaction data, (up 50%),
- My work unit/team uses customer satisfaction data to make improvements within the TCCHD, (up 150%),
- Staff have appropriate opportunities to act to improve work processes, (up 70%),
- And senior leaders, managers, and supervisors address staff concerns about engaging in QI. (up 86%).

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
